



A DAY A TREVISO

VILLA PANIGAI



from the farm Villa Panigai in Treviso 40 Km

Treviso enclosed within its walls offers its tourists a pleasant day walking in the streets along the Sile river in the name of art with its period buildings and small squares but also those who want to go shopping, the city offers in its center several shops. From the gastronomic point of view, Treviso gives birth to the original recipe of sweet Tiramisù and also the land of red radicchio.

PIAZZA DEI SIGNORI is the most important square in Treviso, located in the heart of the city and its cultural, historical and social center. The square, whose current name is due to the presence of the buildings of the ancient Treviso Signoria. In Piazza dei Signori there are some important architectures:

To the north is the Palazzo del Podestà, with the Civic Tower, it was the seat of the Signoria: it dates back to the XIII century; To the east is the Palazzo dei Trecento, the former seat of the Maggior Consiglio. On some days of the year you can visit the main hall To the west the Palazzo Pretorio, with a 17th century façade;

FONTANA DELLE TETTE it is an ancient sculpted fountain of Treviso, which under the domination of the Republic of Venice spilled white and red wine during special celebrations.

DUOMO DI TREVISO the Cathedral of San Pietro Apostolo is the main place of worship of the city of Treviso and seat of the diocese of the same name. Consecrated to Saint Peter the Apostle, it overlooks Piazza del Duomo.

LOGGIA DEI CAVALIERI (westward from Piazza dei Signori) unique building of its kind in Europe, it was built in the second part of 1200, when Andrea da Perugia was mayor of Treviso; it is a brick building with an irregular quadrilateral plan with a roof with four pitches in tiles. In this building only the nobles met to participate, in the good season, in board games.

L'ISOLA DELLA PESCHERIA

is a river island in the historic center of Treviso, where the fish market is held every morning.

PONTE DEI BURANELLI

is a historic bridge in Treviso that allows you to cross the Buranelli canal which then enters the Sile river.

PONTE DANTE

risers in 1865, at the point where the Cagnan river flows into the Sile, the "Grand Canal" of Treviso, creating a truly suggestive glimpse. It is dedicated to the poet Dante who cited this place in a verse of his Divine Comedy, synthetically indicating it as the point: "where Sile and Cagnan accompanies" (Paradiso, IX, 49).
